

meet, the Bishop led a session on 'Value Based Education, the Need of the Hour'. Education should lead to the development of integrated personality and inculcate values like patriotism, humanity etc. Value education is a many-sided endeavor as value itself, the Bishop added. His Excellency gave away the Dr Tharsis Joseph Foundation Award for the Best College Principal in Kerala to Dr Raju George in the function. The Principal has been honoured and felicitated in the function. Sri Ibrahim Kaippani, PTA Vice President, Dr Savio James, Dr Prasadan P.K., Dr Dennis Joseph spoke.

# Every species of living organism needs to be conserved: Dr Jane Smart, Global Director, IUCN

The importance of conserving individual species of life on earth was stressed at an international seminar on 'Biodiversity conservation' organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Mary Matha College, in association with the Wildlife Trust of India (WTI) and the Department of Zoology at the college auditorium on Monday, the 22nd October 2012.

Speaking after inaugurating the function, Jane Smart, Global Director, International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), said the academic community should take initiative in imbibing a conservation culture among the younger generation.

She emphasised the significance of conserving every species of living organisms as close to 25 per cent of the world's mammals, 13 per cent of birds, and 41 per cent of amphibians were facing the risk of extinction.

When the IUCN updated its study recently, as many as 20,219 species were at the risk of disappearance, she said adding that 402 species such as the Egyptian dab lizard and Sichuan Taimen, a freshwater fish from China, were added to the threatened category of the Red List.



Ms. Smart said the mode of habitat destruction for developmental and other related anthropogenic activities posed serious threats to many species. She expressed her concern at the rate of disappearance of living organisms from the earth owing to the activities.

She explained the functioning of the IUCN, the mode of preparation of the Red List of animals and plants, the criteria for the inclusion of living organisms under different categories such as extinct, verge of extinction, and endanger

The Research Officer in Wildlife Trust of India, Dr Nixon Armstrong was the invited speaker in the second academic session. Researchers, Dr Aneesh E M, St Joseph's College, Dileep Kumar & Ms Priyanka M Thanal, Thrissur, Thiruvananthapuram and Mr Misvar Ali of Kannur University presented papers on various topics in Biodiversity Conservation. Dr P.K Prasadan and Dr Joseph K.Job coordinated.

There are a lot of incidents happening against women in Kerala, which are beyond our imagination, Smt K C Rosakkutty Teacher said while inaugurating the College Day Celeberations . "There are a lot of issues related to domestic violence. Young girls are becoming victims of abuse even from their own family members . Women live with fear and insecurity in most houses in rural areas. Sometimes people we meet regularly might be victims. Some remain silent, some hide the pain. There are no proper rules to support those who are not orphans. I plan on creating awareness in the women in our state about domestic violence and how exactly they can save themselves from it .
