- The pilot phase of the programme in our college has been launched in the year 2014-'15, targeting students of the first semester Degree programme (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com).
 - Mr Regi Francis, Asst. Professor of Commerce, has been deputed as the coordinator of the programme by the Principal of the college.
- Ms. Rejitha N A (Mathematics), Mr. Jocy Mon Joseph (English), Ms.
 Manjusha Mohan (Chemistry), Ms. Dimple Thomas (Mathematics) and
 Ms Rajitha Xavior (Commerce), Asst. Professors in corresponding disciplines, were the teachers associated with the programme.
- Five papers in five different subjects (English, Mathematics, Zoology, Computer Science, Physics and Commerce) were identified as the topics to be covered in the programme.
- Language through Literature, Differential Calculas, Complementorycourse
 in chemistry for biological sciences, Financial Accounting, Mathematics
 for Computer Science I & Physics I were the topics on which the
 additional training has been imparted to the students
- Fifty students, ten from each discipline were shortlisted and selected by the teachers to participate in the programme
- Fifteen sessions, each with duration of one hour, have been undertaken in each topic, following the guidelines issued by the Office of new Initiatives, Higher Education Department
- As part of the implementation of the programme, study materials, stationary kit and refreshments were issued and TA was disbursed to

students during the course of the programme.

 Ms Rajitha Xavior (Commerce), were the faculty engaging classes for the second year degree students.
- Five papers in five different subjects (English, Mathematics, Zoology, Computer Science, Physics and Commerce) were identified as the topics to be covered in the programme for the Third and Fourth semester degree students
- Hundred students, fifty each from first and second year were shortlisted

and selected by the teachers to participate in the programme, each batch consisting of ten students.

- Sixteen sessions, each with duration of one hour, have been undertaken in each topic, following the guidelines issued by the Office of New Initiatives, Higher Education Department.
- As part of the implementation of the programme, study materials, stationary kit and refreshments were given and TA was disbursed to students during the course of the programme.
