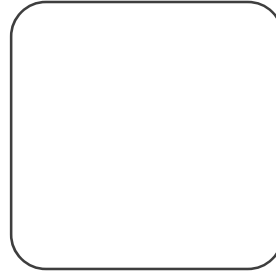

The emblem, together with the motto 'Education for Total Liberation', is symbolic of the ideals the college stands for. The open book, the pen and receiving hands represent the reception and assimilation of knowledge, which liberates the individual from the debilitating shackles of ignorance and incapacity. However, the growth and evolution of the individual through education is not seen as an end in itself. The training, both academic and extracurricular, seeks to foster in the students a keen awareness of their communities armed with the skills to contribute positively to change and reconstruction where required.

The symbols take a new dimension of meaning in connection with the Patron Saint of the College, Mother Mary, whose offering hands represent a complete surrender to the Eternal Wisdom. The tool for imparting wisdom, the pen, from another angle looks like a lighted candle that dispels the darkness of ignorance and it signifies that the learning one receives at the institution is not to be kept to oneself but to be disseminated in the community.



Aims & Objectives

It is with the objective of meeting the higher educational needs of the youth of Wayanad that the Syro Malabar Catholic Diocese of Mananthavady undertook the mission of establishing and managing Mary Matha Arts & Science College. As a Christian Institution, it endeavours to inculcate human values and social justice as envisaged by Jesus Christ. It considers education not just as a search for knowledge but as a great mission in which both the teachers and the students participate in the process of developing human resource for the benefit of the society and the nation.

The college seeks to instil in the students an awareness of their social rootedness and encourages them to be active participants in the construction of a just social order.

Though a minority institution, the college includes in its purview the educational aspirations of the society as a whole, irrespective of religion, caste and social status. The college tries to facilitate and encourage higher education among people who have been denied such opportunities because of social and economic backwardness. The college, situated in a tribal area, takes special care to provide opportunities and facilities to tribal students aspiring for higher studies. Thus, the college seeks to foster equitable social development through the empowerment of individuals who can contribute to the common good.



History of the College

Mary Matha Arts & Science College, an institution run by the Syro Malabar Catholic Diocese of Mananthavady, symbolises the realisation of the dreams and aspirations of the people of North Wayanad. It was sanctioned by the Government of Kerala on the recommendation of the University of Calicut in response to the demands of the people. His Excellency Rt Rev Dr Jacob Thoomkuzhy, the then Bishop of Mananthavady, took upon himself the onerous task of establishing and managing this institution, and he is our founder Patron. The college was formally inaugurated on 23rd October 1995 with three degree courses: Functional English, Zoology and Mathematics. When Kannur University came into existence in 1996, the college became affiliated to it.

His Excellency Rt Rev Dr Emmanuel Pothanamuzhy became the Patron of the college when he was consecrated as the Bishop of the Diocese in 1997. As the founder Principal of Christ College, Bangalore, he had long years of experience as a teacher and administrator. His vision and commitment to academic excellence were guiding beacons in our institution's efforts to achieve its social and educational goals. His Excellency passed away in 2003 and subsequently His Excellency Rt Rev Dr Jose Porunnedom became the Patron.

Rev Msgr. Joseph Kaniamattam was the founder Manager of the college after which Rev Msgr George Njaralakkatt, the then Vicar General of the Diocese, was the Manager for nine long years from 1997 to 2006. After this, Rev Fr Jose Kocharackal, Syncellus of the Diocese, was the Manager till May 2008. Rev Msgr Dr Mathew Madappallikkunnel, the Vicar General of the Diocese was the Manager during 2008-2012. Rev Fr Chandy Punakkattu, was the Manager from May 2012 to May 2017 and during his time many developmental projects were undertaken in the college.

Rev Fr George Myladoor assumed charge in May 2017 as the Manager and he was the Manager upto 2022 April.



On May 2022 Rev Msgr Paul Mundolickal took charge as the manager and Rev Fr Sibichan Chelakappallil assumed charge as the Associate Manager and Bursar.

Dr K T Varkey was the founder Principal of the college from 1995 to 2002. Rev Fr Dr James Maruthukunnel CMI, former Principal of St Joseph's College, Devagiri, Kozhikode was the next Principal, from 2002 to 2006. Dr Raju George took charge on 1st April 2006 and he served the college till March 2014. After his retirement, Dr Saban K V, Associate Professor of Physics, SB College, Changanassery, assumed the office of the Principal on 12th August 2014. He demitted the position on 10 June 2015 to take up another assignment. Then, Dr Savio James V, who served from the beginning of the college as the HoD of the Dept of English, assumed charge as the Principal. After his retirement Dr Maria Martin Joseph took charge as the Principal in March 2019.

The Decennial Celebration of the founding of the college was held in 2005-06 with several innovative initiatives in the academic programmes and in the extending of the infrastructure. In 2006, National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), awarded B++ Grade (with 83.5% marks) to the college and later, in 2013, the college was re-accredited with A Grade by NAAC. In the 3rd cycle of accreditation held in March 2019, the college got B++ Grade.

The college offers eight Degree Courses, two PG Courses and Doctoral Programmes in Mathematics and Zoology. An Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has been instituted to sustain and enhance the quality of education in the post-accreditation stages. Faculty members have undertaken about 30 Minor Research Projects with financial assistance from the UGC and four Major Research Projects sponsored by the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Govt of India and the Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE).

The Vicennial Celebration of the college was held in January, 2014. The IGNOU (Indira Gandhi National Open University) centre was formally inaugurated in June 2015 to further enhance the educational opportunities of the people of the area, especially those who are unable to utilize the benefits of the regular stream of education.

1. Rules & Regulations of the College

1.1. General Rules and Regulations

The Principal of the College shall be the disciplinary authority in respect of the students in the college.

- 1.2. Ragging is strictly banned on the college campus. Anyone found guilty of **ragging** and/or abetting ragging will be punished as per the directives of the UGC, Government and the Supreme Court. All the incidents of ragging will be severely dealt with. Those found guilty will be dismissed from the college and police cases will be filed against them.
- 1.3. In accordance with the policy adopted by the Governing Body and the PTA, the College has implemented strict regulations on **political activities on the college campus** which forbid students from organizing/ participating in any political activity on the campus.
- 1.4. As per the Govt. Order No. Rt/No.346/05/ Higher Edn dated 1-3-2005, students are **not allowed to use mobile phones** on the campus and are permitted to bring two-wheelers only up to the parking area allotted to them near the college gate. Under no circumstances are they allowed to bring four-wheelers to the college.
- 1.5. All the students shall compulsorily wear the prescribed **college uniform** on all working days except wednesdays. Uniform symbolizes unity and uniformity in terms of identity and studentship. It also indicates fellowship and a sense of belongingness to the institution. Hence it should be seen as a source of pride and a symbol of responsibility. Parents are to see that the uniform and hairstyles of their wards are in tune with the decency, dignity and the institutional values.
- 1.6. No celebration shall be held on the campus without the written permission of the Principal.



- 1.7. Programs by external agencies/ professional groups/ paid such as D J, musical events etc. shall not be permitted on the campus. No type of fund raising by the students is permitted, as these practices lead to extortion and misuse of funds.
- 1.8. No vehicles shall be used during celebrations inside the college campus/hostel.
- 1.9. All celebrations on the campus will be under the supervision of the Principal and the staff members deputed by him.
- 1.10. Former students and the general public will be permitted to enter the college campus only for genuine reasons. It will be convenient for the former students if they carry the **punched ID cards** given back to them on expiry. They are not allowed to enter the classrooms without permission.
- 1.11. Students shall not invite any guest, outsiders, students of other institutions or anyone belonging to external organizations to the campus without the permission of the Principal.
- 1.12. Students shall not use the emblem, photo and other symbols of the college in social media (Facebook, WhatsApp etc.) or programmes conducted outside the campus.
- 1.13. The Principal reserves the right to refuse any applicant admission to any programme without assigning any reason if the authorities are convinced that admitting that person is detrimental to the interests and discipline of the college.
- 1.14. The Principal is entitled to take appropriate punitive action on any student for his/her misconduct in the interests of the institution and for the sake of maintaining discipline.
- 1.15. The following also are acts of misconduct:
 - 1.15.1 Staying away from classes without sufficient reason
 - 1.15.2 Disrespectful behavior towards the college staff
 - 1.15.3 Instigating other students to go on strike or participating in strike, dharna etc. in the college



- 1.15.4 Loitering in the corridors during free hours and creating disturbance to the ongoing classes. (During free hours the students are expected to make use of the library.)
- 1.15.5 Unruly behavior causing disturbance to the class
- 1.15.6 Organizing tours without the permission of the Principal
- 1.15.7 Organizing meetings in the college, writing on the blackboards or displaying notices on the college notice board without the permission of the Principal
- 1.15.8 Blocking gates/ doors or passages which would restrict the mobility of the staff and students of the college
- 1.15.9 Involvement in clashes or the harassment of fellow students.
- 1.15.10 Disturbing the functions in the auditorium by shouting, howling or dancing
- 1.15.11 Resorting to any kind of malpractice in the examinations.
- 1.15.12 Collecting money from staff or students without the permission of the Principal
- 1.15.13 Distributing pamphlets, notices or other materials and displaying flags, banners, and posters on the campus
- 1.15.14 Scribbling offensive, abusive or obscene words or figures on blackboards, washroom walls or any kind of writing on the walls, furniture or other surfaces on the college campus
- 1.16 Smoking, consumption of alcoholic beverages and use of narcotic drugs are strictly prohibited. Criminal proceedings will be initiated against those found guilty of the use of alcohol or narcotic drugs on the campus.
- 1.17 Vandalism and destruction of college property will be severely dealt with and the cost of damage will be fully recovered from those responsible.
- 1.18 The college campus and classrooms should always be kept neat and clean. The students should take care not to litter the classrooms and college premises.
- 1.19 The college is not responsible for the loss of money and other valuables belonging to the students on the campus. Students



are advised to keep their belongings safely while leaving classrooms.

- 1.20 Discourtesy towards any member of the staff or any act which affects the discipline of the college will be seriously viewed and in extreme cases it is sufficient reason for expulsion from college. Immorality, grave insubordination, contempt for authority, willful destruction of college property, malpractice in examinations etc. are sufficient reasons for strict disciplinary action.
- 1.21 As directed by the Government of Kerala, the students **should wear ID card tags** on the campus which should be shown to the staff and to the security guards on demand. The ID cards need to be produced for any transactions with the college office.
- 1.22 Students are expected to maintain decency and decorum in their dress and conduct.
- 1.23 Students have to be inside the classrooms after the bell marking the beginning of class hours. Observance of strict silence in the standing posture is mandatory during the morning prayer and National Anthem.
- 1.24 If the teacher is absent, the Class Representative should contact the Head of the Department to seek directions on alternative arrangements.
- 1.25 Late comers should not enter the classroom nor should any student leave the classroom without the permission of the teacher in charge of the class.
- 1.26 Parents/ guardians are expected to attend PTA meetings and to respond to the calls from the college authorities.
- 1.27 Teachers hold the responsibility of maintaining discipline in their classes and on the campus.
- 1.28 The members of the College Union are elected by the students in the Parliamentary mode.
- 1.29 A call to the auditorium or conference halls for any additional programme must be promptly and strictly responded to. No one should remain in the classrooms or elsewhere on such occasions.



- 1.30 Students are to behave with decency and decorum outside the campus also. They should always remember that the good name of the institution is their responsibility.

Code of Conduct for Students

2.

- 2.1 Any unavoidable movements on the veranda (laboratory, auditorium, seminar halls etc.) during class hours have to be in silence. The students should always take care not to disturb the ongoing classes.
- 2.2 No Student is allowed to remain on the campus after 4.30 p.m. unless s/he has obtained special permission for the same for approved activities.
- 2.3 The students are required to follow the stipulations imposed on their campus conduct by the orders of the Hon. High Court, UGC, and Government of Kerala.
- 2.4 The students are expected to spend their free time in the library. They should not loiter on the corridor or gather on the college porch.
- 2.5 No student shall leave the campus during the working hours without the permission of the Principal. He/she shall not be sent out without a valid reason or the request by the parent/ guardian.
- 2.6 Strict silence must be observed in the library, college office, and chapel.
- 2.7 Discipline and decorum are expected from the students during programmes conducted in the auditorium or elsewhere.
- 2.8 Prior permission from the Principal is essential to take part in competitions and games conducted in other places outside the campus.
- 2.9 It is the responsibility of the student to earn a good conduct certificate. It cannot be claimed as a matter of right. Conduct certificates are issued by the Principal on the basis of the reports from the HoDs, Mentors, and teachers concerned.



- 2.10 The Principal has the authority to issue Transfer Certificate to any student during the course of study if his/her conduct and character are found unsatisfactory.
- 2.11 For acts of student misconduct, the Principal may impose punishments such as fines, cancellation of attendance, withholding certificates, blocking educational concessions and scholarships, cancellation of participation in arts and sports competitions, suspension, expulsion etc.
- 2.12 The Principal or other duly constituted college committees may frame and issue disciplinary rules of permanent or temporary nature regulating the conduct of students within and outside the campus in order to maintain the discipline and reputation of the college and the hostels.
- 2.13 Legal action will be initiated against those who destroy the property of the college as per rules including the Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act 1984.
- 2.14 Students who are charged with criminal offences and are under suspension shall not be allowed to enter the campus without permission.
- 2.15 Students guilty of going to other colleges or institutions to take part in acts of indiscipline such as organizing demonstrations or strikes will be deemed especially culpable and punished accordingly.
- 2.16 Students from other institutions and outsiders should take prior permission with valid identity proof to meet the Principal and staff members. They shall not meet or interact with the students of the college inside the campus without the prior written consent of the Principal.
- 2.17 Students from other institutions and outsiders who disrupt any academic activity or functioning of the college office or any unit of the college shall be treated as trespassers infringing on the rights of college authorities to peacefully run the institution and maintain discipline. Any such deed will be treated as an



infringement also on the rights of students, especially the backward and the underprivileged, to have uninterrupted education. Legal actions including contempt of court will be initiated in such cases.

There shall be no discrimination against any community or category of students of the college and immediate stringent action will be taken against erring staff and students.

- 2.18 Outsiders including police and media persons shall not enter the campus without the permission of the Principal.
- 2.19 Taking photographs and recording or exhibiting video/audio materials on the campus without permission is strictly prohibited.
- 2.20 Programs in the college shall be covered only by the persons officially authorized by the Principal.
- 2.21 Vehicle users have to register their vehicle number and license number with the security staff. Special parking permits will be issued to the sick or differently-abled students to park vehicles near the college building.
- 2.22 The security personnel/ designated college staff are authorized to inspect the records of the vehicles entering the campus and record the details in the gate register.
- 2.23 Complaints of the students must be presented through the proper channel. Students and staff can make use of the grievance redress mechanism available in the college.
- 2.24 The college authorities reserve the right to amend, alter or modify the Rules and Regulations from time to time on the basis of the changing requirements.
- 2.25 It is the responsibility of the students and staff to follow the notices/ announcements concerning the rules and programmes of the college from time to time. Ignorance of these rules cannot be considered as an excuse for lapses.
- 2.26 The Principal is the ultimate authority in the interpretation and implementation of the rules and regulations in the best interests of the institution.

Attendance & Leave of Absence

- 3.1 The college works from 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. For the purpose of attendance, all working days will be considered as full working days irrespective of the number of hours. Absence during one hour either in the forenoon or the afternoon session will be considered half a day of absence. Latecomers will not be given attendance.
- 3.2 Semester certificate of attendance and progress required for admission to university examination as well as progression shall not be given unless the applicant has attended at least 75% of the working days of the semester and the Principal is satisfied with the student's progress and conduct.
- 3.3 Leave for a short duration may be obtained from the HoD/Mentor. Application for longer periods of absence must be submitted to the Principal. Application for **sick leave for more than five days** should be supported by a medical certificate. The certificate should be submitted immediately after rejoining.
- 3.4 Absence without leave is punishable. Those who have to leave the campus during working hours should obtain permission and exit passes from the HoDs concerned.
- 3.5 Absence for **ten consecutive working days** will result in the removal of the name from the rolls.
Duty leave for participating in arts/sports events will be granted only to students representing the college or the university in various competitions. In such cases, leave applications should be submitted to the Principal in advance and it should be recommended by the teacher in charge.

Identity Card & College Uniform

- 4.1 Students must **always wear their ID card tags** when they are on the campus. ID cards are essential for bus concession, payment of fee, entry into the library, loan of books, voting at college union election, refund of caution deposit, issue of



certificates etc. Students found without identity cards are liable to be fined or sent out of the campus. Duplicate cards will be issued only in genuine circumstances on payment of Rs.150/-

- 4.2 The identity card must be surrendered when the T.C. is issued. Students shall compulsorily wear the prescribed college uniform on all working days except wednesdays. Uniform symbolizes unity and uniformity and attributes a special identity to the students. It also indicates equality and a sense of belongingness to the institution. Parents should see to it that the uniform and hair style of their wards are in tune with the modesty and dignity that every student of Mary Matha Arts & Science College should possess.

Collection & Payment of Fees

5

- 5.1 Fees shall be collected at the beginning of the academic year (i.e., in June).
- 5.2 Fees for the whole year in a course will be levied from the students who leave the college.
- 5.3 The dates for the collection of fees shall be notified in the college calendar or on the notice board. All cash transaction in the college office will be closed at 2.30 p.m. every day.
- 5.4 Students seeking admission have to pay the prescribed fees at the time of admission. Students joining the college in the middle of a semester have to pay the fees due from the beginning of the year.
- 5.5 Receipts signed by the accountant/clerk are issued to the students at the time of the payment of fees and the students must keep them safe and produce them on demand.
- 5.6 Mistakes, if any, in the receipts issued for payments should be pointed out and corrected then and there. Complaints made later in this regard cannot be entertained.
- 5.7 Tuition fees and special fees prescribed are collected from the students beginning courses (I Year UG and I Year PG classes)



at the time of admission, and from students of senior classes, within a period of seven consecutive working days commencing from the re-opening day. Particular days are allotted to each class and the details of the fee collection are put up on the notice board.

- 5.8 If any student fails to pay the fees or special fees on or before the due date, he/she shall be liable to pay a fine of Rs. 5/- along with the fees on or before the 10th day after the due date. If the 10th day happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be counted as the 10th day.
- 5.9 If the fee with the fine of Rs. 5/- is not paid on or before the tenth day after the due date, an additional fine of Rs. 10 /- will have to be paid.
- 5.10 If the fees and fines are not paid within 15 days from that date, the name of the student will be entered in a special register of defaulters. The attendance of the student would also be taken every day as usual and his/ her attendance or absence would be marked. If the student settles the arrear fees with fine before the last opportunity given for such settlement, he/she would be granted attendance as per actual presence or absence recorded. Students who fail to settle the dues to the college before the last date prescribed will not be presented for the university examination or promoted to the next higher class. The last opportunity for clearing one installment will be the date before the due date for the succeeding installment. A student will be admitted to the next semester only if he/she clears the dues for the previous semester before the commencement of the following semester.
- 5.11 Re-admission fee for a student whose name is removed from the rolls for reasons other than a default in the payment of fees will be Rs. 50/-
- 5.12 Rules 9 and 10 will not be applicable to students enjoying full fee concession by virtue of their community.



- 5.13 Every student is required to pay the prescribed fees for the whole semester for part of which his/her name is on the rolls of the College.
- 5.14 Caution deposit at the rates prescribed is to be paid on admission. This will be refunded after the issue of TC after adjusting dues if any and on surrender of identity cards. Caution deposit remaining unclaimed six months after the completion of the course will be forfeited.
- 5.15 SC/ST/OEC/KPCR students who discontinue the course before getting their concession sanctioned by the Government are required to pay full fees before their transfer certificates are issued.
- 5.16 Collective common fines may be imposed on all the students of the college to realize the loss caused to furniture, tools and lab equipment of college due to the reckless handling of college property.
- 5.17 Fees once paid will not be refunded, except the caution deposit.

Statutory Declaration/Warning

Trafficking , sale and use of Drugs, Alcohol and Tobacco are strictly prohibited in the campus and its premises.

Fee Concession, Stipends & Scholarships

6

- 6.1 Students belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are eligible for full fee concession and monthly stipends at the rate fixed by the Govt. from time to time.
- 6.2 They should produce nativity and community certificates from the Village Officer concerned. Proper applications with necessary certificates have to be submitted within the prescribed time to the SC/ST Department through the Principal.
- 6.3 The **monthly stipend** will be released to the SC/ST students **only on the basis of their good conduct, attendance, and progress in studies**, as certified by the principal.
- 6.4 Students whose family income falls below Rs 100000/- (Rs. One lakh) are eligible for fee concession as per Kumara Pillai Commission Report (KPCR). They will have to produce the nativity and income certificates issued by the Village Officer. All the students who are eligible for e-grants should register online and submit printouts to the college office.
- 6.5 Students who are financially challenged may apply for financial assistance from the Student Aid Fund.
- 6.6 Fee concession is not available for students who join the unaided courses except those belonging to SC/ST/OEC categories.

Examination & Progression

7

Rules concerning attendance and examination (Excerpts from the Kannur University Regulations 2014)

- 7.1 A student shall be permitted to appear for the semester examination only if he/she secures at least 75% attendance. Attendance shall be maintained by the Department concerned. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 12 days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of a Degree Programme may be **granted by the University** on the recommendation of the Department and the Principal. Benefits of condonation of attendance may be granted to students



- 7.2 who attend the approved activities of college/university with prior concurrence of the Head of the Institution. Participation in such activities may be treated as a presence in lieu of their absence on the production of participation/attendance certificate in curricular/extracurricular activities. A student who is not eligible for condonation of shortage of attendance shall **repeat** the course along with the subsequent batch.
- 7.3 Admission to repeat courses should be within the sanctioned strength. However, if more candidates are there, the candidates who have suffered serious health problems, on production of a medical certificate issued by a physician not below the rank of a Civil Surgeon in Government service, may be permitted to repeat the course, with a written order issued by the Registrar, Kannur University (by considering his/her CGPA and percentage of attendance). The number of such candidates should not exceed two.
- 7.4 If a student registered in the first semester of the UG degree programme is continuously absent from the classes for more than 14 days at the beginning of the semester without informing the authorities, the matter shall immediately be brought to the notice of the Registrar of the university. The names of such students shall be removed from the rolls.
- 7.5 Grace marks may be awarded to a student for achievements in co-curricular activities (in Sports/Arts/NSS/NCC) carried out beside the regular class hours. Such a benefit is applicable and limited to each academic year spreading over three years (6 Semesters). **No credit** shall be assigned for such activities.

Admission

8

- 8.1 Admission to all programmes is done as per the rules and regulations of the Kannur University. Candidates need to apply to the university online for admission to both UG and PG programmes. The prospectus is on the Kannur University Website.



Study Tours / Excursions / Picnics

9

- 9.1 Study tours conducted by the college are part of the academic programme. The following instructions should be strictly followed by the students:
- 9.2 Study tours are organized by the Departments concerned. Students are not permitted to organize or conduct excursions or picnics without the consent of the HoD and the Principal.
- 9.3 Written consent in the prescribed form should be obtained from the guardians by all the students who intend going on an excursion.
- 9.4 A detailed programme of travel, stay, places of visit, names of participants etc. should be submitted to the Principal before proceeding on a tour or excursion.
- 9.5 No student from another class will be permitted to join a class going on an excursion.
- 9.6 For a batch of students having more than 20 students, two regular teachers shall accompany the team.
- 9.7 Presence of a lady escort (a regular member of the teaching faculty) is necessary if there are girl students in the tour team.
- 9.8 As far as possible, study tours shall be conducted during the months of November and December.
- 9.9 Booking of vehicles and arrangements for accommodation while on tour should be made only after consultation with the teachers in charge.
- 9.10 The students shall obey all the directions given by class teacher/ teachers accompanying them.
- 9.11 Any act of indiscipline while on tour shall be considered as an act of indiscipline committed on the campus and will attract punitive action.
- 9.12 The use of alcohol, drugs, and tobacco is strictly prohibited while on tour.
- 9.13 The Principal has the right to cancel or to make any modification in the tour programme at any time.



10. **Regulations on Political Activity on the Campus**

- 10.1 The college does not recognize student organizations patronized by political parties on the campus. No student shall get involved in any political activity or abet activities inside the campus in any manner whatsoever and any such activity is hereby banned inside the campus.
- 10.2 Taking part in any political activity by organizing student gatherings inside the college campus for the purpose of doing any activities shall constitute serious indiscipline. Every member of such a gathering shall be individually liable and responsible for the gross indiscipline in this regard and the Principal shall have the power to take disciplinary action against students who indulge in the aforesaid activities.
- 10.3 It shall be considered gross indiscipline to go on strike responding to the exhortation by political parties or their student wings. Participants in strikes will have to face appropriate disciplinary action decided by the authorities.
- 10.4 No student of the college shall stage or indulge in any activity like dharna, gherao or blocking corridors/classrooms/office/ other places inside the campus. Such activities shall be treated as misconduct.
- 10.5 No student shall shout slogans inside the classrooms, office, corridors or any other place on the campus or cause disturbance to the functioning of the institution. These activities shall be treated as misconduct.

Procedure for Disciplinary Action and Punishment

- 11.1 The Principal of the college shall be the disciplinary authority in respect of the students in the college.
- 11.2 If it comes to the notice of the teachers and Principal that a student or a group of students have committed a misconduct and the Principal is realized that there is prima facie case in the



allegation, he shall immediately pass an order suspending the student/students from the college.

- 11.3 If the Principal feels that the delinquency alleged requires further investigation/enquiry, he shall report the matter to the College Council. After reporting the matter and after seeking the views of the College Council, the Principal shall appoint a committee of teachers to enquire into the matter and to submit a report.
- 11.4 The Enquiry Committee so appointed shall conduct enquiry without delay after gathering oral or written evidence from the complainant as well as the persons against whom the allegations were made. The Enquiry Officer shall give fair and reasonable opportunity to all the parties and shall submit a report to the Principal. After the receipt of the report, the Principal shall consider the report and take appropriate action which he deems fit, including the imposition of the following punishments:
- 11.4.1 Imposition of fine
- 11.4.2 Issuance of compulsory Transfer Certificate (TC)
- 12.4.3 Dismissal from the college.
- 12.5 In the event of dismissal or compulsory issuance of transfer certificate, the Principal shall forward the order along with a report to the University.

Rules and Regulations for the Smooth Functioning of the Campus

Excerpts from the GO regulating the general conduct of students on the campus

Government of Kerala – Dept. of Higher Education

No. 26433/GI/15/H.Edn.

Thiruvananthapuram, 12.10.2015

- ◇ All celebrations in the campus, including Union activities, should be held only after getting prior permission from the Head of the



Institution. Celebrations of any type should be communicated to the Head of the Institution through Staff concerned Advisor at least five working days prior to the event, with programme details of the program and guests attending, the source of funds, expenditure estimates etc. The Discipline Committee should monitor and supervise the celebrations in the college.

- ◇ Students' Union activities should be supervised by a Committee chaired by the Head of the Institution with Staff Advisor as Convener, and HoDs and Discipline Committee members.
- ◇ All students have to wear identity tags in the college.
- ◇ No type of vehicles should be used during celebrations inside the college campus/ hostels.
- ◇ Students' vehicles will be allowed only up to the designated parking area. Entry beyond that point is strictly prohibited.
- ◇ If any complaint is received from hostel inmates or from the public to the Head of the Institution about the misbehavior of students and about activities like keeping weapons, consuming alcohol, using drugs in campus/hostel rooms etc., steps will be taken as per the rules in force.
- ◇ CCTV cameras will be installed in selected common places such as entrance/exit gate of the College and hostel.
- ◇ Public, including former students, will be allowed to enter the college campus only for genuine reasons. They will not be allowed to enter the classrooms and hostel rooms in any case.
- ◇ Programmes by external agencies/professional groups/paid programmes such as DJ, musical events etc. should not be permitted inside the campus. No type of fundraising from the students should be permitted, as these practices lead to extortion and misuse of funds.
- ◇ Bike race/motor car race/elephant procession or similar activities should not be permitted inside the campus/hostels.
- ◇ In the interests of the security of students, police may be informed in advance about all festival celebrations.
- ◇ For all students' programmes in the campus, the presence of teachers is mandatory.



Activities Amounting to Ragging & Anti-Ragging Measures

Ragging is totally banned on the college campus and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging is liable to be punished in accordance with the *Code of Criminal Procedure*. According to the UGC Regulations on *Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Education Institutions 2009*, any act of ragging will be treated as a criminal offense. A committee has been constituted as per rules to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the menace of ragging on the college campus.

The following are some of the actions that will amount to ragging:

- i. Any conduct by any student whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating/handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- ii. Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension in any fresher or any other student.
- iii. Asking any student to do any act which the student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of freshers or any other student.
- iv. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher
- v. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- vii. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student.
- viii. Any act of physical abuse including sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person



- ix Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts or public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture of a fresher or any other student any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority.

Administrative Action in the Event of Ragging

The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed as follows:

- a) The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Committee.
- b) The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments:
- I. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - II. Withholding/ withdrawing scholarships and other benefits
 - III. Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or another evaluation process
 - iv Withholding results
 - v. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
 - vi. Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel
 - vii. Cancellation of admission
 - viii. Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters
 - ix. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.



The College Union

The College has an elected College Union constituted with the following objectives:

1. To train the students of the college in parliamentary democracy to make them responsible citizens who are not only aware of their rights but also their duties, and responsibilities
2. To develop in them the spirit of harmony and cooperation necessary for working/learning together in a peaceful environment surpassing the divisions of caste, creed, religion and political affiliation.
3. To provide forums and opportunities for the development of good character, leadership, efficiency and spirit of service in the students.
4. To organize debates, seminars, supplementary academic programs, competitions in arts & sports etc. so that students may develop leadership qualities and sociopolitical awareness.
5. To encourage extracurricular activities which supplement the core academic programs.

Codes and Regulations of Elections

1. The election to the college union is conducted in the presidential mode (Clause 6.2.2 of the JM Lyngdoh Committee report and the order issued by the Supreme Court of India - SLP No. 24295/2004).
2. College Union Election shall be conducted a day fixed by the Vice Chancellor.
3. All the students enrolled in the college shall be members of the union and have the right to vote and contest to the college union.
4. Election shall be held by secret ballot on the principle of each member having a single non-transferable vote for one part without postal ballot according to the rules framed by the syndicate of the University from time to time.



5. The tenure of the office of the college union shall be one academic year from 1st June to 31st May.
6. Elected members of the executive council consist of the following office bearers the Chairman, Vice Chairman, General Secretary, Joint Secretary, University Union counsiler, Magazine Editor, Fine Arts Secretary and The General Captain.
7. The Association Secretary of each department and each representatives of each classes (I,II &III DCs I & II PGs) will also be elected to be post of the Executive Council.
8. The conduct of the election and formation of the college union presuppose the maintenance of peace and harmony of the campus and the non-political character agreed upon by the Management, PTA and the students.

Rules for Central Library

1. The staff and students of the college are entitled to the use of the library.
2. The library will be open from 9.00 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. on all working days and from 9.30 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. on Saturdays.
3. Reference books, periodicals and newspapers will not be issued outside. Before consulting reference books the user should sign a register after making necessary entries in it.
4. Strict silence should be maintained in and around the library.
5. Readers have to keep all their belongings at the entrance of the reading room including the issued or other text books. If any one needs to keep books (printed) with them, please report it at the Counter.
6. Magazines and papers should not be misplaced.
7. The users must not disfigure or damage by writing on or mishandling any books, magazines, manuscripts and maps belonging to the library.
8. No tracing or mechanical reproduction shall be made without prior permission of the librarian.



9. The readers will be responsible for any damage done to the books or other property belonging to the library. They are required to replace such books or property or pay the price as decided by the authorities. If one of the books in a set is damaged, the whole set will have to be replaced.
10. The students may return the books on all working days except during the lunch hour **(1 to 2 p.m.)**.
11. Before leaving the counter, the reader should satisfy himself/herself as to whether the book lent to him/her is in good condition. If it is not, he/she should immediately bring the matter to the librarian's notice. Otherwise he/she is liable to be held responsible for the replacement of the book.
12. The loan period is usually 14 days. However the librarian can recall any book at any time from a reader.
13. A book returned after the due date will entail a fine of Rs. 1 per day.
14. Members are not allowed to sublet the books of the library.
15. All the books should be returned to the library before March 31st of each academic year. However the final year students should return the books before final year examinations.
16. Books issued for the holidays should be returned within 2 days after reopening.
17. The Staff should return all the books at the close of the academic year.

The College has two units of the National Service Scheme (Unit No. 33 & 46 of Kannur University). The N.S.S Units facilitate training for 200 students in social work. The Units are under the supervision of **Ms Jisha T E and Dr Sanu V F**

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

A Unit of the National Cadet Corps consisting of 160 cadets (1- Company) comprising men and women is functioning in the college. This is an army wing under 5 Kerala Battallion NCC Wayanad and **Mr Bibin Jose** is the NCC Officer. The Kannur University awards 3% grace Marks for the 'B' Certificate holders and 4% for the 'C' Certificate holders. Like wise the Cadets who attend the Summer Camp and the Republic Day Parade Camp are eligible for 6% and 7% Grace Marks respectively. In addition to this the cadets completing two years in NCC will get weightage marks for admission to various courses. Students who pass the B and C Examinations will find it easy to get commissioned posts in the Defense Service.

Facilities in the College

01. CENTRAL LIBRARY

The College has a fully automated central library as the major learning resource of the institution, with automated KOHA software. The library regularly subscribes to many national and international journals, daily newspapers and buys new books periodically. A spacious common reading room with separate reading space for staff members is provided in the library. The central library has a Network Resource Centre (NRC) with 14 computers for free internet browsing for the students. Photocopying and printing facilities are also available in the library. Students can access INFLIBNET in the Central Library. 100 mbps internet facility is available in Central Library.

02. UGC NETWORK RESOURCE CENTRE

The objective of the centre is to create awareness among staff and students about the use of computer in various activities like administration, finance, examination and research. In addition to it the information and communication network would help the college to have access to multimedia materials in teaching and learning at places of eminence in India and abroad.

03. SPORTS & GAMES FACILITIES

The Dept of Physical Education promotes interest in sports and games among students. Coaching camps in various disciplines will be conducted during the year. There are two seats in a degree course and one seat for the PG courses under the sports quota. A photocopy of the original application along with copies of sports certificates should be presented to the Dept of Physical Education for considering a student for admission under sports quota.

A few seats are reserved for sports in all professional colleges in Kerala. Grace marks will be awarded to students who represent University in Inter-University competitions. Students are prohibited to participate in tournaments conducted by external agencies without prior permission from the Principal. Violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action.

Students who are proficient in sports and games are eligible for scholarships awarded by Sports Authority of India and State and Central Governments.

In order to promote sports and games, the college has established various sports facilities that include Multipurpose Indoor Sports Complex with the financial assistance of the UGC.

Research Centres

MATHEMATICS RESEARCH CENTRE

The Mathematics Research Centre (MRC), which was approved in the Year 2005 and is attached to the PG Department of Mathematics, is a recognised research centre of Kannur University. The centre has a research library with a large collection of research journals, published papers and books. The MRC receives financial assistance from the DST and the UGC. It also maintains academic exchange with many research institutions and universities in India.

ZOOLOGY RESEARCH CENTRE

The Zoology Department, which is a recognised research centre of Kannur University, offers research programme (PhD) in Zoology. The Department strives to create an environment that enables research and systematic enquiry to attain excellence. The current focus of research is in the Ecology and Taxonomy of fresh water and marine Zooplankton and reproductive physiology and endocrinology of freshwater crustaceans. The Centre has also conducted minor research projects on some areas of biodiversity in Wayanad. These research projects are funded by agencies like the UGC and KSCSTE.

COMPUTER SCIENCE RESEARCH CENTRE

The PG Dept of Computer Science is a recognized research center of Kannur University from this year onwards. The Center has a full-fledged research Lab and library with a large collection of research journals (Scopus & UGC Care Listed), published papers and books. The center focusses on blending academic knowledge and experience from the industry catering to the societal needs and demands. The center focuses on high level and high quality studies, according to international standards and also to organize national or international courses, conferences, seminars and similar events and raising public awareness on research and development. Center has regular tie-up with national and international universities, research organizations and industry for research.
