




Feedback from all the stakeholders (faculty, students, alumni and employers), were collected during the year 2020-2021. Feedback forms were designed using Google Form which is a survey administration software from Google. The stakeholders were given a set of questions. For each question they were given five options to choose from, which are, below average, average, good, very good and excellent. Each of the options were later mapped onto a rating of five point scale. The highest rating of 5 is excellent, while the lowest rating 1 is below average.

STUDENT FEEDBACK

Students from all the years of study participated in the feedback and their responses can be summarized as follows


- Most of the respondents consider the syllabus suitable for the programme.
- Syllabus of the programme is considered need based and received an average rating of 4.17.
- Clarity on the aims and objectives of the syllabus received a rating of 4.3.
- Respondents rated the availability of reference materials as very good.
- The balance between the theory and application received a rating of 4.07
- Majority of respondents rated that the syllabus generated interest in the subject area.
- As per the observation of the respondent the curriculum has prospects for higher education/employability. This aspect of the curriculum received an average rating of 4.23.
- Respondents also observe that the curriculum gives scope for internships/training/research. The rating received was 4.11.



FACULTY FEEDBACK

The major inferences from the feedback of the Faculty are the following:


- Average rating of 3.98 was given for suitability of syllabus to the programme.
- Few people rated that the syllabus is need based and received a rating of 3.45.
- Most of the faculty members are of the opinion that the aims and objectives of the syllabi are well defined (4.05).
- Majority are happy with the availability of reference materials (4.78).
- The balance between theory and application is considered good. This aspect received a rating of 3.53.
- Faculty noted that the syllabus generated interest in the subject area (3.68).
- They also appreciate the aspect that the curriculum has prospects for higher education and employability (4.11).
- Most of them have the opinion that the curriculum gives scope for internship/training/research (3.31).



ALUMNI FEEDBACK

The following observations were made from the alumni feedback survey done for the year 2020-2021

- Respondents rated the suitability of the syllabus at 3.67.
- Good number of them agreed that the syllabus is need based (3.54).
- Aims and objectives of the syllabus were quite clear for most of them (3.58).
- Alumni also stated that they received enough materials during their study period (3.54).
- A rating of 3.56 was given for the balance that the syllabus has for theory and application.
- Most respondents found the syllabus as one that generates interest in the subject (3.44).
- Prospects for higher education/ employability was rated at 3.56.
- Considerable number of them marked that the curriculum gives scope for internships/training/research (3.3).



EMPLOYER FEEDBACK

Employers were given a form with a set of ten questions related to their employees who were the beneficiaries of the curriculum

- Most of the employers who participated in the feedback find that the course offered is relevant to their organization (3.99).
- They find the syllabus sufficient in addressing the demand of the organization (3.7).
- An average rating of 3.7 was given for the effectiveness of the curriculum in accentuating critical and innovative thinking.
- Employers rated the adherence of the curriculum in inculcating skill oriented human resource to be good (3.84).
- \circ Their employees are found to be competent in accordance with the curriculum (4.14).
- They also find that the employees have language proficiency in the professional scenario (4.14).
- A very good number were happy with the adaptability of the employee in the formal working environment (4.58).
- Employees are considered to adopt a pragmatic approach to challenging situations (4.28).
- Employers rated the commitment of the employee to the well-being of organizations and society to be very good (4.14).
- Curriculum enrichment is considered to be adequate for perfecting employability (3.99)
